*50 **Minutes**

The minutes of the meeting of the General Licensing Sub-Committee held on 5 April 2004, were confirmed and signed as a true record.

*51 **Exempt Information**

RESOLVED that the classification given to the documents to be submitted to the Sub-Committee, be confirmed and that the reports relating to exempt information be dealt with under Part B of the agenda.

*52 **Application for Variation of an Annual Public Entertainment Licence**

Strand Inn, 1 The Parade, Exmouth

The Sub-Committee gave consideration to the granting of a Variation to an Annual Public Entertainment Licence for Strand Inn, 1 The Parade, Exmouth.

RESOLVED that an application for the variation of an Annual Public Entertainment Licence be granted for Strand Inn, 1 The Parade, Exmouth to vary the permitted licensing hours for the premises to extend the licensing hours on Sunday from 10.30 pm to 11.30 pm, with the Corporate Director – Communities being requested to carryout a check on the noise limiter device fitted. The licence to be reviewed by the Sub-Committee when it is due for renewal in March 2005.

*53 **Application for Renewal of an Annual Public Entertainment Licence**

Truly's Café Bar(Truly Scrumptious), 3/4 & 6 The Parade, Old Fore Street, Sidmouth

The Sub-Committee gave consideration to the granting of a Renewal of an Provisional Annual Public Entertainment Licence for Truly's Café Bar (Truly Scrumptious), 3/4 & 5 The Parade, Old Fore Street, Sidmouth.

RESOLVED that the Annual Public Entertainment Licence for Truly's Café Bar (Truly Scrumptious), 3/4 & 6 The Parade, Old Fore Street, Sidmouth be renewed, subject to the licensee continuing to comply with the conditions applied to the previous licence.

*54 **Application to Licence a Horse Drawn Hackney Carriage**

Consideration was given to an application to licence a Horse Drawn Hackney Carriage Vehicle from Miss V Smith.

RESOLVED (1) that Miss Smith's application to licence a horse drawn hackney carriage be granted to permit the carriage to be operated in Honiton on Mondays, Wednesday, Thursdays and Sundays between 10.00 am to 12.30 pm and 2.30 pm and 4.30 pm and Tuesdays and Saturdays between 1.00 pm and 4.00 pm and at all other times for Special Occasions including weddings, funerals, civic functions and any other occasion subject to the approval of the Licensing Manager;

(2) that the proposed fare structure for horse drawn hackney carriages within the District be approved.

Councillor B Nicholson requested that his abstention from voting on this issue be recorded.

*55 **Private Hire Vehicle Application**

The Sub-Committee gave consideration to an application to licence a Lincoln Town Car Auto Limousine (Stretch Limousine), as a private hire vehicle which did not comply with the District Council's Private Hire Licensing Conditions as it was over 4 years old and was left hand drive.

RESOLVED that the application to licence a Lincoln Town Car Auto Limousine as a Private Hire Vehicle be granted, as it was considered to be a specialist vehicle, subject to the additional conditions outlined at the meeting (see Appendix A attached).

*56 **Exclusion of the Public**

RESOLVED that under Section 100(A) (4) of the Local Government Act 1972 the public (including the press) be excluded from the meeting as exempt information, of the description set out on the agenda, is likely to be disclosed.

*57 **Horse Drawn Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence Application**

Consideration was given to whether an applicant was a fit and proper person to be licensed as a Horse Drawn Hackney Carriage Driver.

RESOLVED that Ms VS's application for a Horse Drawn Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence be granted, subject to her successfully completing the Certificate of Competence.
