Pick up the poop

Most people do, but if you don't clean up after your dog you could be putting other people at risk and can be fined up to £1,000.



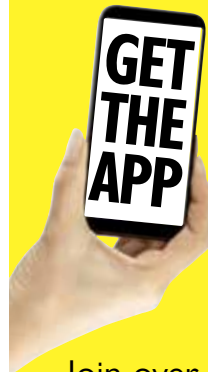
When you're walking your dog you can dispose of dog poo in any bin, not just a red dog bin. Even better, please take it home with you and use your landfill waste bin.

Please remember

- ✿ Always pick up after your dog
- ✿ Keep your dog under control so that they don't stop other people enjoying the beach
- ✿ Make sure your dog is microchipped and wearing a collar and tag or you could be fined
- ✿ Don't walk more than six dogs at a time
- ✿ Keep your dog on a lead where required

Strays

Stray dogs will be picked up and detained for up to seven days. Owners have to pay all collection and kennel costs before they can have their dog back. Unclaimed dogs are normally re-homed.

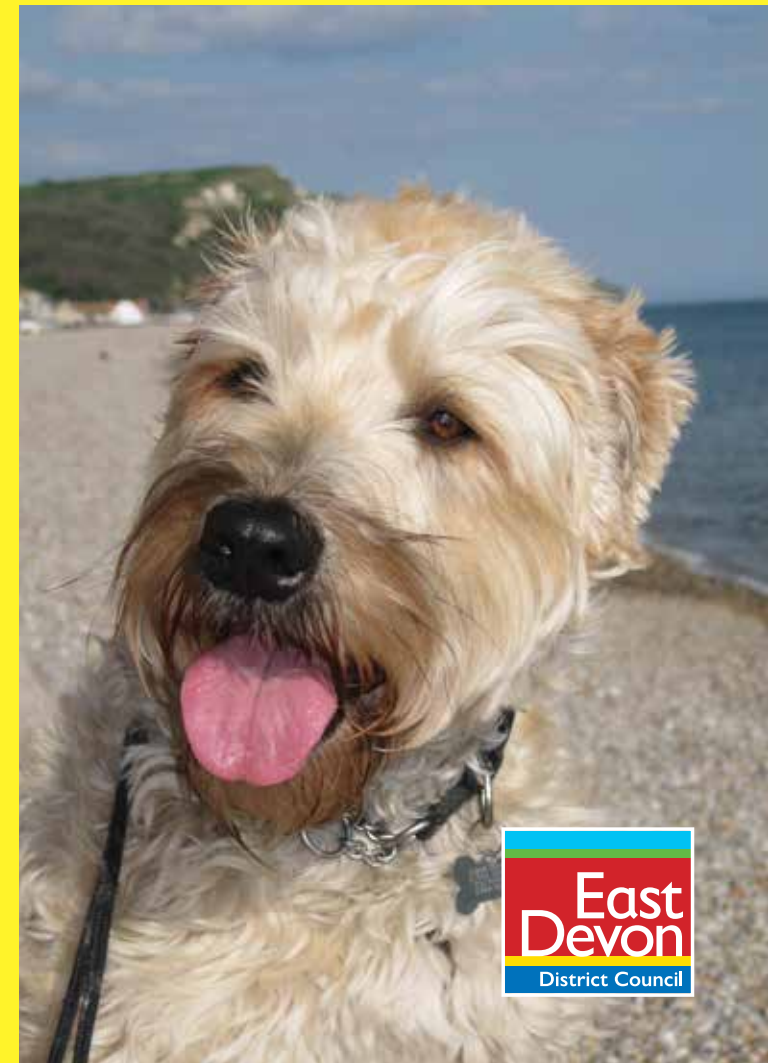

Seasonal beach bans

From 1 May to 30 September, all dogs are banned from sections of East Devon beaches as shown here. Dogs also aren't allowed in certain areas like children's play areas.

Sidmouth



▲ The beach between the eastern facing access ramp opposite Ham Lane in the east to a point 100m west of the beach huts at Jacob's Ladder. You may access the dogs allowed area by taking your dog on a lead across Jacobs Ladder beach.

Seaton



▲ From the boundary of the Parish of Seaton in the east to the end of the sea wall at Castle Hill in the west (including the walkway immediately adjacent to the beach).

Budleigh Salterton



▲ The beach from a point immediately opposite Lime Kiln in the east to the outfall opposite South Parade in the west.

Beer



▲ The beach from a point immediately opposite the south western most point below Charlies Yard in the east and extending in a westerly direction for 200m. Dogs must be kept on a lead between Charlies Yard and the last beach hut in the east.

Exmouth



▲ The beach between the second groyne before Orcombe Point in the east to a point opposite the Octagon in the west.
