What can I put in my green waste bin?

- ✓ Grass cuttings
- ✓ Flowers
- ✓ Small tree branches (up to 10cm thick)
- ✓ Loose leaves
- ✓ Shrub and hedge trimmings



Please shut the lid

Branches less than 10cm thick



Length to fit in your bin

What we can't collect

- ✗ Large branches (over 10cm thick)
- ✗ Turf
- ✗ Earth, soil, stones and gravel
- ✗ Pet bedding
- ✗ Plant pots
- ✗ Invasive weeds (like Japanese Knotweed and Himalayan Balsam)
- ✗ Green waste with Ash Dieback disease

WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?

We can only collect things we're able to recycle and if they're in the right container

If you live in a flat and use a shared recycling store, find out how to recycle at eastdevon.gov.uk/flats



Your recycling box

- ✓ **Cardboard** including egg boxes, flattened brown cardboard boxes, tubes from toilet or kitchen rolls, toy packaging, and food packaging like cereal boxes, and cardboard sleeves

- ✓ **Small electrical items** like irons, kettles and toasters
- ✓ **Paper**
- ✓ **Shredded paper** in a bag to prevent litter on the road
- ✓ **Glass bottles and jars**
- ✓ **Textiles and shoes**
- ✓ **Batteries**



Your recycling sack

Wash off food residue and squash to save space

- ✓ **Cartons and Tetra Paks**
- ✓ **Foil** including trays

- ✓ **Plastics** including bottles, yoghurt pots, plastic meat and vegetable trays, and margarine and ice cream tubs
- ✓ **Tins and cans**
- ✓ **Aerosols**

QUALITY COUNTS



Be a five-star recycler. Make sure the quality of your recycling is high and help the environment.



Please don't include things we can't recycle yet



Put these in separate bags to keep them clean and dry



Can I recycle greetings cards and wrapping paper?



Yes, if they're plain.
Put in your recycling box.



No, if it has glitter or foil.
Sorry, we can't accept this for recycling yet. Put in your wheeled bin instead.

- ✓ Tea bags and coffee grounds

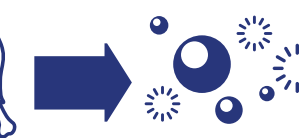
Food waste put into your outdoor food caddy is collected every week, instead of three weeks in your bin
