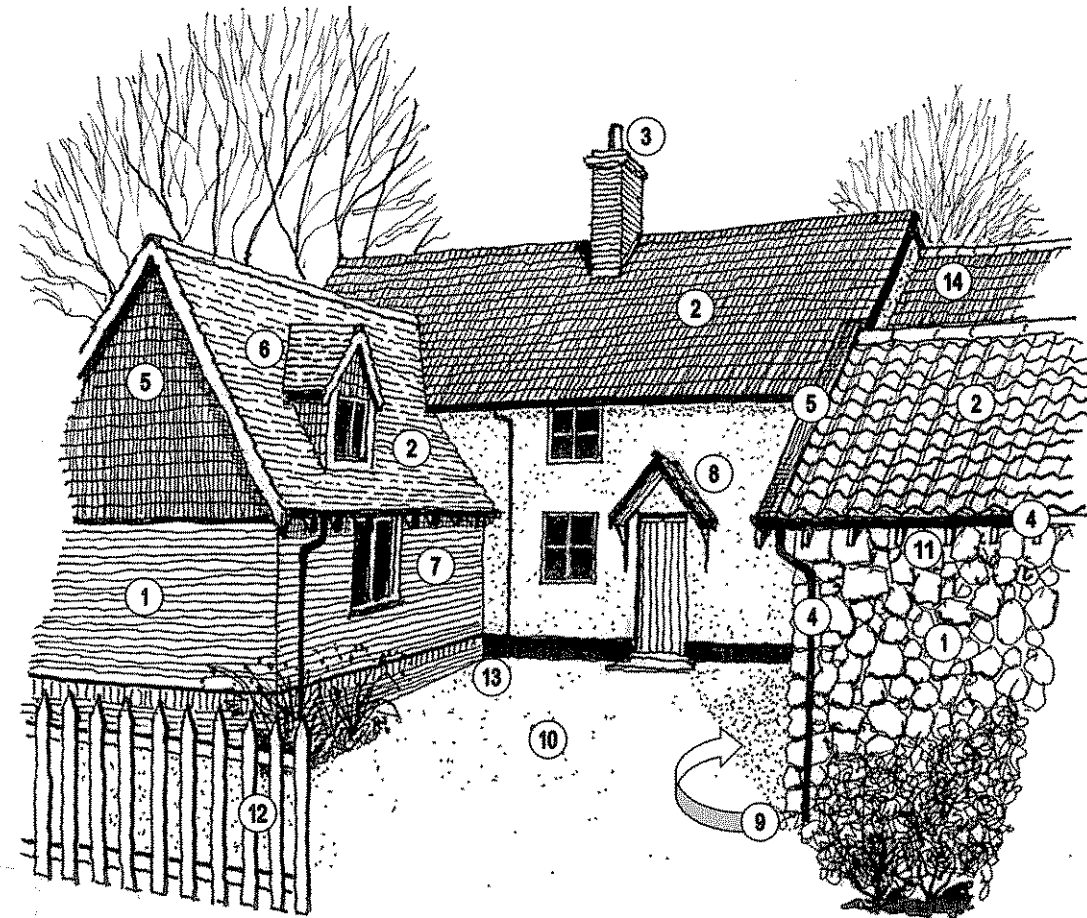


4.5.4 DESIGN FEATURES

| 1 | Walls: traditional materials, brick, stone, rendering, stained boarding. | 7 | Windows: deeply inset, painted timber on listed buildings. No top hung casements. Should not dominate wall area in street scenes. |
| 2 | Roofs: clay tiles, pantiles, slate, thatch, steep slopes. | 8 | Porches, canopies: pitched roofs, substantial overhang. |
| 3 | Brick constructed chimneys, clay pots. | 9 | Garages: pitched roofs. Timber doors. Avoid large doors facing street scenes. |
| 4 | Dark coloured rainwater goods, cast iron on listed buildings. | 10 | Shingle driveways. |
| 5 | Gable ends: timber bargeboards and verge cappings, boarded gables. | 11 | Exposed rafter feet at eaves. |
| 6 | Pitched roofs to dormer windows. Dormers should not dominate roof. Tile or boarded cheeks. | 12 | Timber palisade or hedges to frontages. |
| | | 13 | Brick or black painted plinths. |
| | | 14 | Extensions to listed buildings should be visually defined. |
