



Wet and Wild Winter Weekend

Part 1: The daytime

The winter cousin of the successful summer Wet and Wild weekend will be based around Colyford Common Local Nature Reserve and the adjacent Black Hole Marsh. Drop-in day time activities such as bird watching, bird ringing and (hopefully) beasts from the estuary will be on during the following times:

Saturday 13 February 1pm – 4pm

Sunday 14 February 10am – 4pm

Monday 15 February 10am – 4pm

Guided walks are scheduled within the above times:

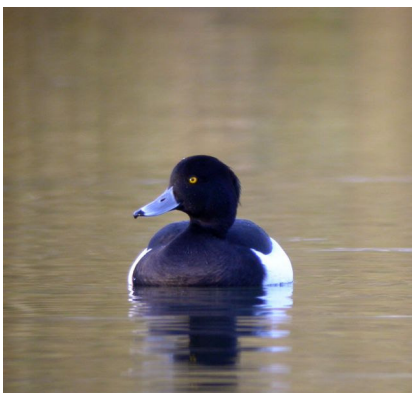
10.30am The surprising history of the Axe Estuary - a walk to learn about the wider history of the Axe which has undergone many different guises in its time (Sunday & Monday only)

11.30am The mammals of the Axe – although we probably won't see them on the walk, come along to find out about otters and water vole on the Wetlands (Sunday & Monday only)

1.30pm Black Hole Marsh – a guided walk around the saline lagoon, to learn about its development and management. We will be having a look at the tidal valve, discussing the creation of the islands and finding out why this place is so good for birds

2.30pm Colyford Common – a guided walk to learn about its history and management, the cattle and the birds

Seaton Tramway is kindly running **reduced cost trams** especially for visitors to the Wet and Wild Winter Weekend. Trams will leave Seaton Terminus on the hour from 10am until 4pm. The trams will be stopping at a temporarily created 'halt' at Black Hole Marsh for passengers to disembark. The trams will be returning to Seaton at approximately 10 minutes past each hour. If you prefer to park and walk, then limited parking is available at Colyford Memorial Hall on the Saturday and Monday ONLY.
