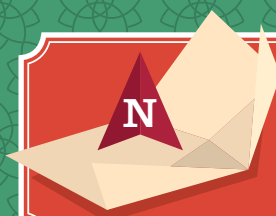


ABOUT THE PROJECT

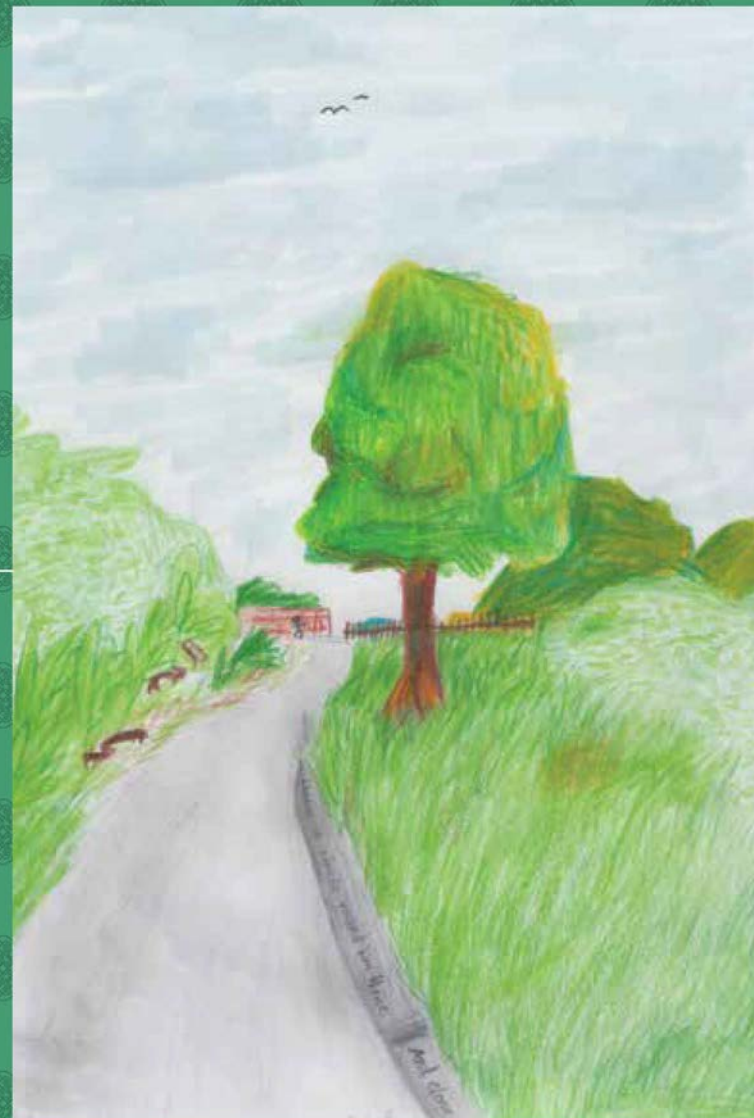


GETTING LOCAL CHILDREN INVOLVED – A KEY PART OF THE PROJECT
